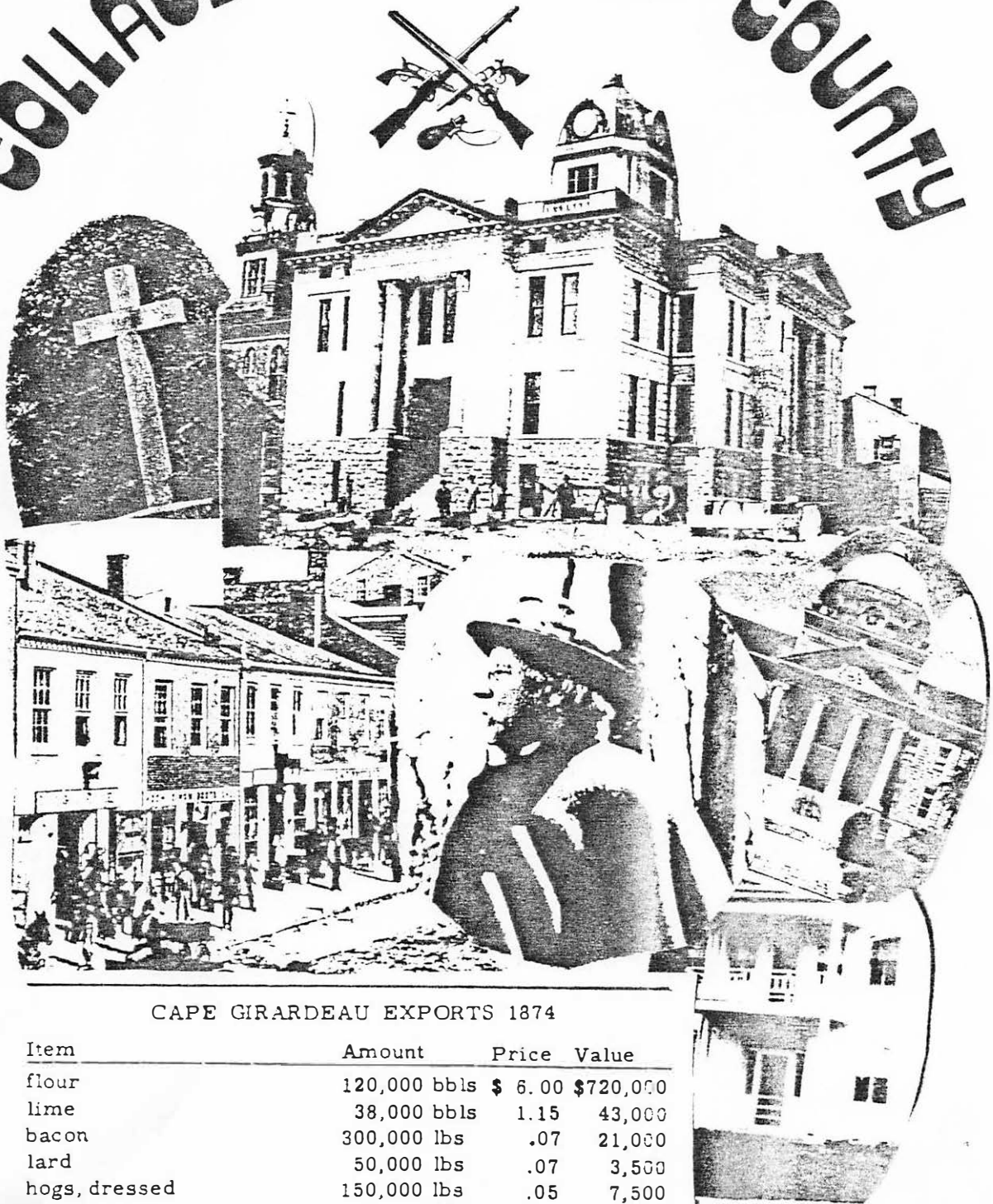

\* \* \* ZARILDA J. SHANER \* \* \*

But few direct representatives of the old settlers are among us to remind us that we are yet only about one century from the earliest settlement of this county by the whites. One by one we pass away to join the "innumerable Caravan" that have gone before us.

On July 15, 1896 Zarilda J. (Russell) Shaner died at her home four miles north-west of Jackson, leaving only two survivors of the old Byrd family that settled this county ninety-seven years ago namely her sister, "Aunt Betsy McKenzie", who now lives near Quitman, in north-west Missouri, and her first cousin, "Aunt Clarissa Byrd Roberts" of this county.

In the fall of 1799 there landed at Cape Girardeau a company of immigrants from east Tennessee, the Byrd and Russell families. Among the former was Clara Byrd, a girl of eleven years, and among the latter was James Russell, a lad a few years her senior.

They became the Mother and Father of Zarilda J. (Russell) Shaner, the object of this sketch, who was born on Byrd's creek five miles north of Jackson, Nov. 19, 1823, on the farm which William Hoffman now owns.

Her grandfather, Amos Byrd, born in 1737, with his wife and her own father, James Russell, and his wife all lie buried in Cape Girardeau County.

When this was yet the Territory of Louisiana, and when the Spanish Government was passing liberal titles of land to the occupants of her territory, the Byrd and Russell families shared in her liberality, as a reference to the old land titles of this county will prove, hence the ancestors of Zarilda J. Shaner have owned their soil under the governments of Spain, France and the United States.

Zarilda J. Russell was married to Joseph Y. Shaner in 1842 and to them was born nine children, only three of whom reach majority. Mary P., first wife of H.W. Howard, both deceased, and John B., deceased, and her surviving child, Wade H. Shaner. So of her immediate family the only survivors are her son Wade H. Shaner and her two grandchildren, Ed. Howard and his sister Mollie P. Wyatt.

Zarilda J. Shaner's life has been worth the living, as her many friends, neighbors, and relatives will testify. She was ever ready to speak a good word for everybody, and hers was a home for the orphan, the afflicted, and the out-cast who needed comfort and cheer.

The writer of this could not help but think while the minister in the last sad rites was speaking a most deserved eulogium to her good name, that she had shown her faith by her good works, which speaks to us more eloquently than all words of men, for there was the poor boy, grown to man's estate, whom she helped when poverty was at the door; and there was the orphan whom she had cared for without a murmur; and there was the out-cast, and the man who had fallen by the wayside to whom she had given a home; and all of these had come as strangers to her gates. Their presence there testified that a life had not been spent in vain. Who ever lived near her knew her, and loved her. Her neighbors were heart-felt mourners at her funeral. Truly a mother in Israel has gone from our midst to join the great majority of her kinsmen who have preceded her to the beautiful shores of the Better Land.

Died on 19 February 1880 at the residence of Benjamin Wyatt near Mayfield, Kentucky.

S.D. Portis died 25 July 1886. Below this entry is another which reads: Died on 26 July 1886 at his residence in Marble Hill, Missouri, S.D. Portis aged 52 years.

The next entry is a newspaper clipping pasted into the Bible which reads: Died February 17, 1890, in Marshall County, Kentucky, Elizabeth, wife of W.H. Portis and daughter of J.J. and Martha Johnson; born in Warren County, North Carolina, professed religion, joined the M.E. Church, lived a consistent member near forty years. She was patient in her affliction bearing it with christian fortitude. B.B. Risenhoover

Alpha Lee Welch died 5 February 1895.  
Died at St. Louis age 67 years, 1 month and 11 days, Mary H. Portis, 28 September 1934.  
William J. Portis died 14 September 1946 at St. Louis, MO.

The Portis family moved across the Mississippi River from near Mayfield, Kentucky to Cape Girardeau County, Missouri about 1874.

Family tradition has that Benjamin Portis was killed while visiting the Benjamin Wyatt family in Kentucky. Exactly what happened is not now known but he was supposedly shot by another person.

The name Davenport was originally spelled Devenport and the name Frizzelle is spelled several different ways: Frizell, Frizzell, Frizzel and Frizel.

#### COLONEL WILLIAM H. McLANE

Colonel William H. McLane was born in Cape Girardeau County, July 6, 1816, the youngest son of John McLane and Lydia Lorange and grandson of a Revolutionary soldier. He was only eight years old when he began helping in a store where he had a thorough training as a Merchant's Clerk. After his Father's fortune was depleted by losses he told the sons that they could have whatever they made as their own while they were minors. The mother provided William H. McLane with his clothing, thus at an early age he started to make his own way. He was a man of steady habits, of great ambition and energy, and for some years of his youth he would arise at three in the morning and study until it was time to open the store and get his breakfast.

After clerking, he engaged in merchandising for himself and also conducted a farm. He clerked in Illinois for several years, and on returning to Missouri went to work in the store of William C. Moore, whose daughter he married.

Col. McLane and George Clodfelter owned the first store at Appleton, a business opened by Kimmel and Taylor in 1829. His residence and place of business for a number of years was at Appleton in Cape Girardeau County, and he was a merchant there until after the war.

When the war came, he found the McLane family divided. Col. McLane and two of his brothers, James and Samuel, being the Union men, while the other three, Joseph, Anson and Alfred were southern in their sympathy. Two of them also had sons in the Confederate Army. Col. McLane and his father-in-law owned some negroes, but neither believed in the doctrines of slavery.

Col. McLane had represented Cape Girardeau County in the State Legislature before the war and was one of the out-spoken members against secession in 1861. When the war came he was commissioned a Col. of the Eighth Provisional Militia and was stationed at Cape Girardeau. His regiment was raised October 4, 1862.

Shortly after the close of the war, Colonel McLane moved to Henry County and established himself in Clinton as a merchant. He was elected to represent that county in the Missouri General Assembly.

Colonel McLane married Catherine Moore, the daughter of William C. Moore and Isabel Schroder. They had four children: Mrs. Mary McBeth; Mrs. Isabel Beauvais; Mrs. Lydia Roberts and Miss Catherine McLane.
