LEO NAPOLEON DOYLE

Leo Napoleon Doyle, son of Irishman Miles Doyle and Sarah "Sally" Morrison, was born 14 June 1832 on his father's farm north of Cape Girardeau. Between 1850 and 1860 Leo and his brother, Theodore, operated a wood yard which supplied the river boats with fuel (wood). However, during the war, Leo and his brother-in-law, Patrick Garathy, moved to Cape Girardeau and entered the mercantile business, a profession he retained until his death on the 24th of January 1900.

On 27 April 1874 Leo married Frances "Fannie" Lennon, daughter of Simon Lennon. After Fannie's death Leo married a second time to Catherine M. Gale in 1882. There were no issues to either marriage.

Catherine Gale Doyle was apparently orphaned and came to Cape Girardeau with a brother and sister from Cole County, Missouri, her birth place, at the age of five to live with her Uncles Constantine and William Gale. She lived in their house for sixty-one years. . . until her death in 1913. (The house became known as the Doyle-Gale house and was located where the Southeast Missourian newspaper building now stands.)

Although Leo Doyle was in the mercantile business the greater part of his adult life, there are indications that he had passions for the railroads and steamboats. Louis Houck writes in his MEMORIAL SKETCHES that Leo was director of Houck's MO and ARK Railroad for over thirty years; and also that he was a director and assisted in organizing the Perryville Railroad Company. Houck recognizes the fact that Leo Doyle was one of the few citizens who invested cash in bonds for the railroad connection from Cape Girardeau to the Iron Mountain Railroad. Credit is also given to Leo Doyle for contributing stock to make the Bloomfield Gravel Road a free public road.

A "Memorial" article appears in the Southeast Missourian on Saturday, February 3, 1900 stating that Leo Doyle "punctually kept a daily weather record, as well as a record of the principal events occurring in the community—a veritable chronicle of the town". Consequently, quite by accident, the late Homer Hartle of Millersville, purchased at a second—hand store on Good Hope Street, Cape Girardeau, MO, a ledger/dairy written by Leo Doyle.

The dairy, purchased in 1965, contains the date, time temperature, weather and events of the day. A CGCGS member has abstracted information of historical and genealogical value and we will print it on a continuing basis.

JACOB SEBACK (SEABAUGH) WILL

Will of Jacob Seback was proved in open court January 1810 State of North Carolina, Lincoln County

In the Name of God A men. I, JACOB SEBACK of Lincoln County, State of North Carolina, being of sound mind & memory and understanding, but considering the mortality of this lif, Thinkfit to make this my last Will & Testament in the following manner.

I recommend my soul in to the hand of Allmighty God and my body to earth to be buried in a decent Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors, as touching such worldly estate where with it has pleased God to bless me in this life.

I give, demise and dispose of the same in the following manner.

First of all it is my Will and Desire, that out of my moveable estate shall be so much sold which amount pay's all my just Debts, and when my Debts is pay'd. I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Margaret my Plantation with all the moveable Estate belonging to me, upon Condition, the she shall have, enjoy & possess all my estate, Land and tenements during her lifetime, if She remains a Widow; but after my decease, it is my Will, that all my moveable Estate is to be Valued, by two freeholders to make an inventory thereof, that the value thereof may be known. in cas she should marry again; and if She marry's I give unto my Wife out of my Estate, Two beds and furniture, a Spinning Wheel, one iron pot, one iron kettle, one tubb?, froil?, six pewter plates, six spoons, six knives and forks, and no more where with she shall be satisfied, than or likewise after her decease my Plantation Land & Tenements with all the moveable estate shall publicly be sold and the division is to be made amongst my children, and her children by her first husband, in the following manner that my youngest children, John Sebach, and Margaret Sebach shall each of them have a legacy of fourty dollars in forehand out of my estate and than they both shall have an equal share with Jacob Sebach, Peter Sebach, Lionder Bollinger, Christian Bollinger, Susanna Bollinger, Anna Mary Bollinger, and if my estate amounts to so much that each of these children has to get for share each each fourty dollars and the two youngest John Sebach, and Margaret Sebaugh a double share each of them eighty Dollars, have and not before this is satisfied my other children shall fall in to and equal share of the remainder part of my estate with the foregoing be named children and their or have an equal share then with all her benamed children names so shall is viz: Catherina Sebach, Joseph Sebach, Georg Sebach, Magdalena Sebach, Elizabeth Sebach. It is also understood that I gave her the Plantation during her lifetime but if she marry's again the Plantation is to be sold publicly with all the moveable estate and shall in all points by punctually observed as before mentioned, and it is further my desire that my children is to be raised in a Christian life manner and it should appear to my Executors that she doth not bring them up in the Said like manner, my Executors shall have a full power to take the Children out of her hand, and bind them to proper persons. I do also constitute make and ordain my beloved Friends Peter Hoyl and Henry Roth to be my executors of this my last Will and Testament and I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke and disannull all and every other former Wills & Testament, legacies and bequeaths before named and made. hathrying and confirming that this and no other to be my Last Will and Testament.
