Frustration sets in quickly as you discover that a translator is not always at hand. Hopefully the following list will aid you in deciphering some information that is commonly used on tombstones.

# edgeenah (ajeniah/ejaniah/edjniah) VIRGIN of Bollinger County, Missouri

by Edward D. Virgin

Edgeenah had no formal education; could not even sign his name, and although proof of his parentage remains to be found, it appears that he had at least three brothers and two sisters; Hugh Anderson (more commonly known as Anderson), James, Enoch, Lyrilda (Rilda), his twin, and Angeline Virgin and probably others.

Bollinger County, Missouri, was created 1 March 1851 from Cape Girardeau, Wayne, and Stoddard Counties. All locations herein are in Bollinger County, Missouri unless otherwise specified.

Edgeenah Virgin was born in what is now known as Bollinger County, probably in April 1831 and was enumerated in the 1850 Cape Girardeau District #14 census, in the family of Samuel Verden (Virgin). Dwelling No. 1391, as follows:

The order of listing in the above family group, indicates that the last named person. John, age 10, was not a natural member of this family. It is the considered opinion of the author of this article, that this is the son of Jessie Virgin who married Lavisa Manker 19 August 1832 in Cape Girardeau County, by Levi D. Tankersby, Justice of the Peace of Lorance Township, and was enumerated in the 1840 cansus of Lorance Township, Cape Girardeau, as being 30 years of age and under 40 years of age, Jessie Virgin died prior to 6 February 1846 when William L. Miller and Henry Miller posted a bond of \$250,00 for Leuvicey Virgin administrative of the estate of Jessey Virgin, deceased. On the same day Luvicey Virgin swore that the heirs of Jessie Virgin, deceased, were Luvicey Virgin (widow), Mary A.S., John, and Elizabeth C. Virgin, So by the time of the 1850 census Marcy (Mary) Virgin had married Larkin Taylor on 6 August 1848, John was enumerated above, and Elizabeth, age 8 was enumerated with the family of William Verden (Virgin), in the same order of listing as above, for John in Dwelling No. 1388.

A record of Edgeenah Virgin's marriage has not been found, but from the age of his daughter. Cordelia Jane Virgin, in the 1860 census he must have been married to Lucinda.

Under an Act approved 4 August 1854, Ajaniah Virgin appeared before Jacob Tobler, Clerk of Cape Girardeau County Court, on 29 August 1857, and executed an "Affidavit for Actual Settlement and Cultivation" for 120 acres. Swit of Swit of Section 14;

 $NE_{4}^{\frac{1}{4}}$  of  $NE_{4}^{\frac{1}{4}}$  of Section 22, and  $NW_{4}^{\frac{1}{4}}$  of Section 23, T29N, R9E. He paid the Jackson Misouri Land Office \$60.00 on 4 September 1857, and was granted a patent 10 September 1859 by President James Buchanan.

On 25 March 1859 Adjaniah Virgin executed another "Affidavit for Land entered for the Use of an Adjoining Farm" under the same Act, for an additional 40 acres, being the  $SW^{\frac{1}{4}}$  of  $SW^{\frac{1}{4}}$  of Section 23, T29N, R9E. He paid the Jackson Missouri Land Office \$20.00 (\$15.00 gold & \$5.00 silver) on 23 June 1859, and was granted another patent from President James Buchanan, 1 August 1860.

The 160 acres made up by these two tracts liest athwart Virgin Creek and appears to be the basis for the creek's name.

In the 1860 census of Liberty Township he was living in Dwelling 332, next to Samuel Virgil (Virgin) in Dwelling 331 and in whose family group were included his brother, James, and sister, Angeline. His brother, Enoch Virgin was enumerated in Dwelling 334 and Anderson Virgin in Dwelling 345. His enumeration was as follows:

Edginiah Virgin, age 27 M Farmer RE \$400 - PP \$300 b MO Lucinda Virgin, age 28 F b MO Cordelia Virgin, age 5 F b MO

Along with his brothers, Enouch and Anderson, on 5 August 1861 he joined Company B, Fremont Rangers Missouri Home Guards Volunteers. Egeniah Virgin was reported to have left his company three weeks before the same was disbanded on 12 Dec 1861. However his military record pension file in the National Archives shows he was discharged on 10 Dec 1861.

Edgeman Virgin, a Private, of Company D, 2nd Regiment MO Lt. Arty Volunteers was enrolled on 28 May 1863, at Cape Girardeau Missouri for three years. On 20 September 1863 his organization was formed into the 2d Batt'y A, 2 Reg't Missouri Art'y. He was described as being born in Bollinger County, age 32, a farmer, with blue eyes, black hair, dark complexion, and height of 5 feet 10 inches. He was mustered out, with his company, at Benton Barracks, St. Louis, Missouri, on 24 August 1865.

It is interesting to note that Edgeenah Virgin and his brother, Anderson Virgin, can not be located in the 1870 census. Especially so, because this census was taken during the time (1866-1872) when Anderson Virgin was proving up on his homestead of 160 acres.

His daughter, Miss Cordelia Jane Virgin, married Lorance Fowler, son of David and Rosetta Fowler natives of North Carolina, 7 January 1872. The marriage was performed in the residence of and by J.M. Shell, J.P. They had one child, Charles, who was 4 years of age when his widower father was remarried to Mary Jane Eaker on 30 Sept 1877.

About November 1878 Edgeenah Virgin, along with James W. Stepp, the widower of both of Edgeenah's sisters (Lyrilda/Rilda and Angeline) moved to Hood County, Texas, Bluffdale Post Office, where he resided until 1880 when he moved back to Bollinger County in time to be enumerated in the 1880 census of Liberty Township in Dwelling 9, as follows:

On 16 August 1881 Ejanish Virgin bought for \$400.00 from Scott and Edna M. McGlasson. his wife, of Cowley County, Kansas, 200 acres of land in Bollinger County, the NE and the NET of SET of Section 10. T28N. R9E.

Then on 21 December 1881 Edjnior Virgin and Lucinda Virgin, his wife, sold for \$800 to Lorenze Green their original 160 acres which they had purchased from the U.S. Gov., Jackson Missouri Land Office.

About November 1882 Edgeenah moved back to Hood County Texas where he resided until about August 1883 when he moved back to Bollinger County.

Edgniah Virgin on 27 October 1883 bought for \$330.00 from James W. Stepp and Sarah Stepp, his wife, 68 acres which lays North of Castor River, known as the James O. Crites land, being part of the  $S_{\frac{1}{2}}$  of  $NE_{\frac{1}{4}}$  of Section 11, T28N, R9E.

On 21 March 1884 Ejniah Virgin and Lucinda Virgin, his wife, made their marks and sold for \$700.00 to James W. Stepp 160 acres, a part of the NE+ and the NE+ of SE+ of Section 10, T28N, R9E. It should be noted that on 15 April 1915 Alva H. Virgin, Lue Quimby and Louis Quimby, her husband, Cora Hastings and Walter Hastings, her husband, heirs of Edjniah Virgin, deceased of Greenbrier, gave a Quit Claim Deed to Harrison M. Stepp of the town of Greenbrier, for 10 acres, a part of the NE+ of NE South of Castor River, in Section 10, T28N, R9E. This Quit Claim Deed was required to fully account for the total of 200 acres Ejaniah Virgin had bought in 1881, because on 2 January 1885 Ejniah Virgin and Lucinda Virgin, his wife, sold for \$50.00 to Wm. H. Siler 30 acres off the East side of that portion of the NE4 of Section 10. T28N. R9E. lying North of Castor River.

On 28 July Edgenor Virgin and Lucinda Virgin, his wife, sold for \$50.00 to the Brownwood Northwestern Railway Company a 100 foot wide railroad right-of-way, for so long as the same shall be required and used for a railroad and no longer. being in the SEt of NEt of Section 11, T28N, R9E.

Lucinda Virgin must have died prior to 14 February 1899 when Egeniah Virgin declared himself as being single and unmarried in the sale for \$330.00 to Alva Harrison Virgin (who at that time was 7 years of age), 68 acres, part of  $S_2^1$  of NE lying North of Castor River, known as the James O. Crites land, in Section 11, T28N, R9E.

On 30 December 1884 William E. Virgin married Rebecca Ellidge (Eldridge). Wm. Ellidge (Eldridge) guardian of Rebecca Elidge and Edginer Virgin, father of William E. Virgin, each gave their assent to said marriage. The children of this marriage were:

  - 5. Louella/Lue Virgin b January 1895 MO married Lewis Quimby

William E. Virgin, father of above, died 1897 and is buried in the Greenbrier Cemetery. After his death Rebecca Virgin married James C. Massey on 26 December 1899. They are enumerated in the 1900 census of Wayne Township in Dwelling 174, as follows:

Virgin, Cora M. gr daug b Aug 1889, age 10 - Single b MO
" Alvah H. gr son b Jan 1892, age 8 - Single b MO
" Louella gr daug b Jan 1895, age 5 - Single b MO

On 1 August 1908, when he was 16 years of age, Alvy Virgin entered into an agreement to sell  $2\frac{1}{2}$  acres, part of the  $SW_{\frac{1}{2}}$  of  $NE_{\frac{1}{4}}$  of Section 11, T28N, R9E, to John Owens, for \$75.00, and that he would convey a deed when he could legally do so. This land is known to be the West end of the Jace Virgin tract. This agreement was approved by:

becca Massey, Mother Cora Virgin, Sister Lu Virgin, Sister

Edgeenah Virgin, on Certificate 576, 590, was receiving \$17.00 a month when he was dropped from the pension roll because of his death on 13 July 1908. The place of his or his wife's burial has not been determined, but they could be among those buried with uninscribed field stones in the Old Virgin's Burial Ground, with his three, above named, brothers.

The last account of this branch of the family, bearing the name Virgin, appears to be when Alvy H. Virgin, single, on 11 September 1915 sold for \$2500.00 to John I. Wiggins 68 acres, known as the James O. Crites land, being all of the  $S_{\frac{1}{2}}$  of  $NE_{\frac{1}{4}}$  of Section 11, T28N, R9E, lying North of Castor River.

CGCGS is compiling a list of naturalization records available in Cape Girardeau County Circuit Clerk Office. Although there are numerous naturalizations recorded, only fifty-nine papers have been located that contain detailed information. These particular documents have been copied in their entirety and are being put in book form along with other naturalization records currently being prepared. This book of Naturalization Records of Cape Girardeau County will be placed in CGCGS Library and also may be purchased from the Society in the near future.

#### DECLARATION OF INTENTION

State of MO County of Cape Girardeau

In the Circuit Court of Cape Girardeau County

I, Christian Pensel, aged 36 years, occupation farmer, do declare on oath that my personal description is: Color White, complexion Light, height 5 feet 6 inches, weight 140 pounds, color of hair Dark, color of eyes light Brown other visible marks none; I was born in The Kingdom of Byron Germany, on the 3 day of April anno Domini 1 876, I now reside at Jackson, Cape Girardeau County I emigrated to the United States of America from Byron, Germany on the vessel\* Rein; my last foreign residence was Drochenan, Byron Germany It is my bona fide intention to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to William II German Emperor, of which I am now a subject; I arrived at the port of Baltimore, in the State of Maryland on or about the 15th day of August, anno Domini 1 885; I am not an anarchist; I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy; and it is my intention in good faith to become a citizen of the United States of America and to permanently reside therein:
