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

What Can You Find in a Petition to Partition File?

The Case of Charles Wall

(Box 9, Bundle 14 of Cape Girardeau Circuit Court files, 1845, Cape Girardeau Co. Archive Center)

[Editor's Note: While conducting some research recently, I found it necessary to look at a court case bundle involving the petition to partition the estate of Charles Wall, who died between 22 February and 22 August 1842. I was quite surprised at the materials in the file, including information on heirs not found in the probate bundle, an original certificate from the Board of Land Commissioners (from 1806), and others. So, I thought it might be of value to transcribe the documents. Part I of the transcription is given below. Short lines indicate different sides of a sheet, while complete lines indicate separate sheets]

We the commissioners of land claims in & for the District of Louisiana for and on behalf of the United States do give & grant unto Terence Dyal – and his heirs a tract three hundred and ten arpens – of land Situate District of Cape Girardeau --- Provided So much land be found vacant there. By virtue of his having actually inhabited & cultivated the Same prior to & on the twentieth Day of December year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and three.

Memorial to the President by Citizens of the Territory. [No date, 1806]

To the President of the United States.-

The subscribers Citizens of the Territory of Louisiana, respectfully represent; That they have learned with regret, a Petition is now in circulation, in this Territory, for the appointment of a person, to succeed General Wilkinson, in the office of Governor, whom we believe will not give satisfaction to the people in general.—Without intending to dictate to the President, we beg leave to observe, that we have the fullest confidence, in the talents, and integrity of both Colonel Return J Meigs Junior, and Colonel Samuel Hammond, either of whom, should they meet your approbation, will we believe, by their mildness, and Republicanism, restore harmony to the Territory, and administer its Government, with ability and satisfaction.—
[French Text] Also - Omitted here)

[Transcriber's note: The column of numbers before the names, represent the number placement of the signature within each section. The sections represent the particular copy of the petition on which the signature appears. The notation (X) after a name signifies that the signature was by the Signator's mark.]

The full list includes all of present-day Missouri and possibly northeast Arkansas. It appears to have been signed by a substantial number of Cape Girardeau District residents (although not all). Thus, it constitutes a good substitute for a tax list. (The earliest Cape Girardeau Co. tax list surviving is 1814.) The District included parts of present-day Scott and Stoddard County, Wayne Co., and parts of Iron and Madison counties. Spellings are quite subject to the transcriber's interpretation.]
