Loyalty Oaths Taken in Cape Girardeau County – 1865-1866

[State Historical Society of Missouri, Cape Girardeau County Oaths of Loyalty, C1062, Columbia.] (Transcribed by Bill Eddleman)

Early in 1865 delegates to a Constitutional Convention drafted a new Missouri Constitution. The resulting document took a hard line regarding many of the issues that divided the country before the Civil War. Among other things, the new constitution abolished slavery. Another provision in Article 2 required teachers, lawyers, clergy, those holding any public office, officers of corporations, and voters swear a loyalty oath. No one refusing to take the oath or those who had been rebels could vote. Needless to say, voters approved the Constitution in June 1865. Consequent court cases ended with the U. S. Supreme Court striking down requirements for such oaths, and Missouri voters removed the sections relating to the loyalty oath in 1870.

A list of at least part of the oaths sworn in Cape Girardeau County is in a single volume now in the State Historical Society of Missouri, Center for Missouri Studies in Columbia. These were transcribed from photographs of the original taken by Bill Eddleman in October 2022.
