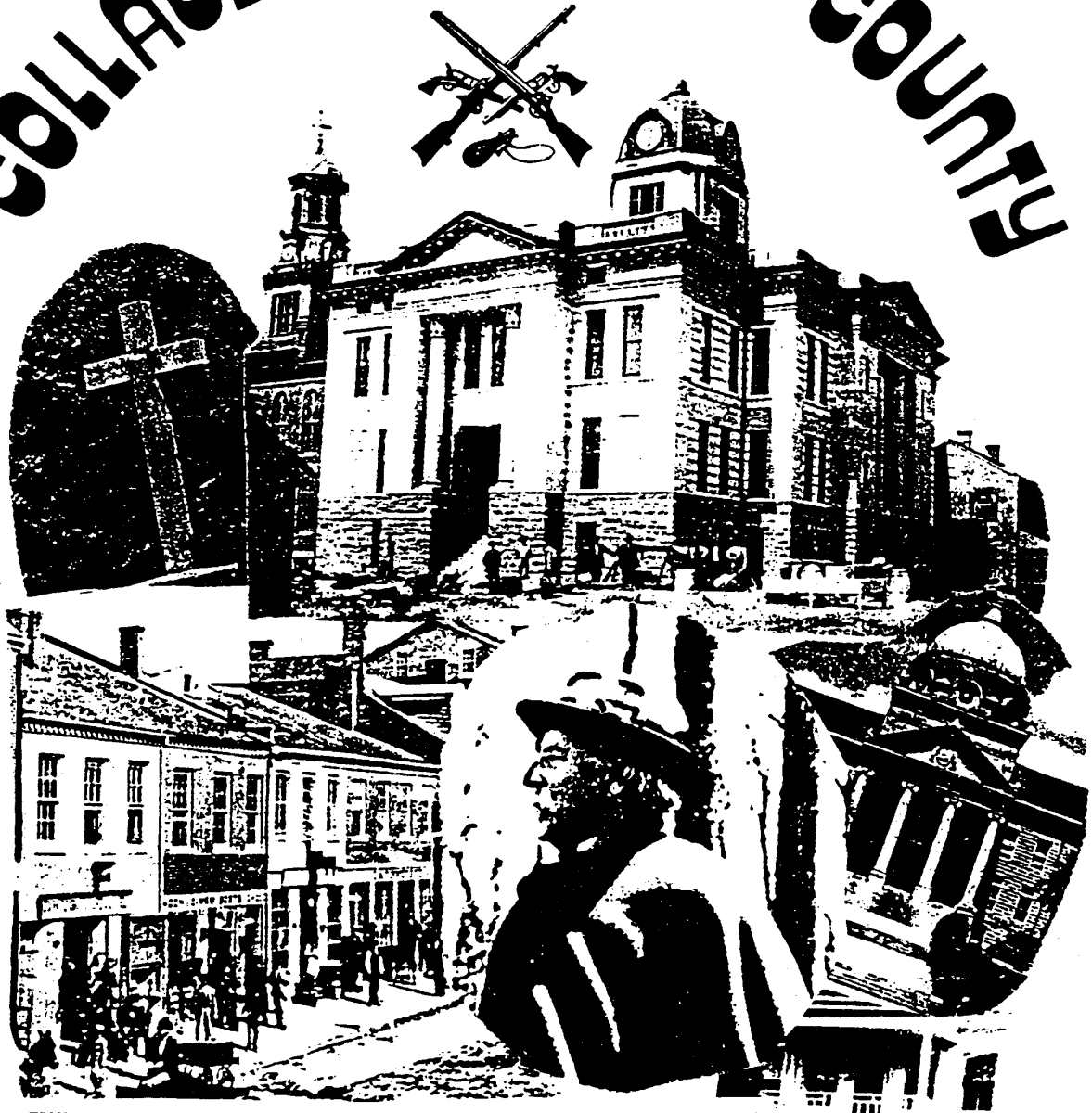


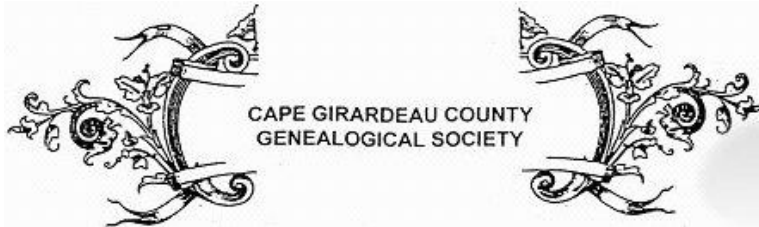

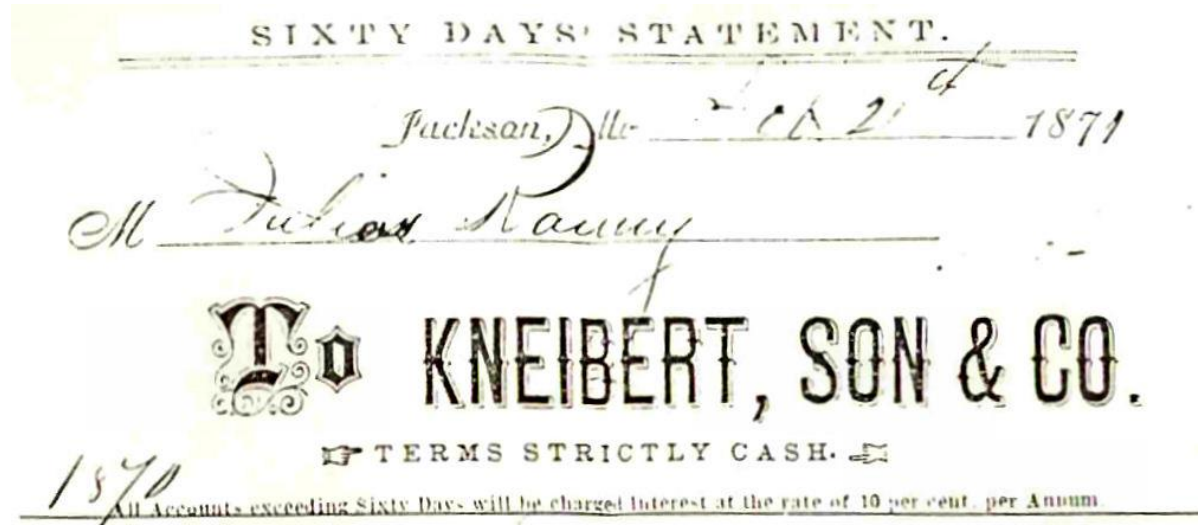

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Oct 21st 1872

On Saturday before the fourth Lords day in September, a council convened at the old Hebron Baptist to take into consideration the propriety of reorganizing or reviving the Church, The council was organized by electing ~~B+~~ Elder G. T. Mizer Moderator and Bro James Wilkinson clerk. We found the old church book, but it was so torn that we could not get therefrom the date of the original organization, but upon inquiring of old brethren we find it to have been some time 1820. the grounds for house and grave

yard having been given by Elder Thos P. Green who was for a long time Pastor of the church The church also had from time to time the services of Elders Williams and Thompson and afterward by Elder Canterbury until 1859, after this the church had no regular meetings though Bro John Henry Clark continued to preach here until the time of his death about three years ago since which time ~~they~~ we have had no regular service. The council found one member of the old organization, Sister Watkins who in connection resumed the old organization and received by letter Brethren Foster, Graves, and Thomkins, and Sisters Foster, Graves Thomkin, Hopper, Collins, and McDowel. After which the church appointed a committee to draft articles of faith rules of decorum and church covenant to report at their next

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regular meeting this being Saturday before the fourth Lords day in October. The Church then called Elder J Reid to preach to them the fourth Sabbath in each month, church meeting being Saturday before. and Adjourned to meet net month.

Articles of Faith

Rules of Decorum

1st The ordinance of the Lords Supper shall be celebrated at our regular meetings in April and October.

2nd The covenant shall be read at the celebration of the Supper and the admission of new members.

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Covenant

Having been as we trust brought by divine grace to embrace the Lord Jesus Christ, and to give ourselves up wholly to him, we do now solemnly and joyfully covenant with each other, to walk together in Him with brotherly love to His glory as our common Lord. And to the end that we may stand perfect and complete in all the will of God, and that the glory of Christ may be manifested in the salvation of men, it is our solemn purpose, as God shall give us strength, to exercise a mutual care, as members one of another, to promote the growth of the whole body in Christian knowledge and true holiness, and to let our light shine before the world; particularly to uphold the public worship of God and the ordinances of His house, by a regular attendance thereon, to search diligently the sacred scriptures to train our children, and those under our care, with a view to Christ's service and the enjoyment of heaven, to contribute cheerfully of our property for the support of the poor, for the maintenance of a faithful ministry of the Gospel among us, and for the spread of the Gospel in all the Earth; to exhort, and if occasion require, to admonish one another in the spirit of meekness, considering ourselves lest we also be tempted; to cheerfully submit to, and conscientiously enforce, the wholesome discipline of the church – keeping ever the unity of the Spirit in the bonds of peace; and to endeavor by example and precept, to teach transgressors

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the ways that God whose we are and whom we serve; remembering that as in baptism we have been buried with Christ and raised again, so there is on us a special obligation henceforth to walk in newness of life; and may the God of peace, who brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus ~~Oh~~ that great Shepherd of the Sheep, make us perfect in every good word and work, to do his will, working in us that which is well pleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom his glory forever and ever. Amen.

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
